February 11 is World Day of the Sick, an observation started by Pope John Paul II as a way for believers to offer prayers for those suffering from illnesses. The day coincides with the commemoration of Our Lady of Lourdes.

Last week Jesus healed a man by commanding the unclean spirit to come out. This week we hear more about Jesus responding to his longing for wholeness and healing. After healing Simon's mother-in-law many came to him in the evening after the Sabbath sunset to be healed and cured of demons. In the morning, Jesus went alone to pray. This time of prayer is important to pay attention to. Jesus heard in his own prayer his call to proclaim the reigning presence of God by moving on to other towns, to move on from yesterday's enthusiasm to tomorrow's unknown. Pope Francis might refer to this as going out to the peripheries.

Jesus' compassion and healing of the sick is a sign of the Kingdom of God. The Church continues to extend Christ's healing presence to others in its ministry to the sick. In the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, the Church prays for spiritual and physical healing, forgiveness of sins, and comfort for those who are suffering from illness.

Missionary Discipleship:

As a family make a list of people who need Jesus' help. As a family, pray for these people who are in need through the power of Jesus' name and word. List ways your family can take action and bring the healing power of Jesus to others.

Family Table Talk

Question for Children: What can you do to help your friends and classmates know more about Jesus?

Question for Youth: Jesus knew that his mission was for everyone, not just one village or group of people. How can you reach out to others (outside of friends and family) and offer them hope and Good News?
