**God's Vineyard** 

The Bible frequently uses the image of the vineyard to express the relationship between God and His people. The vineyard image provides the assurance that God remains in relationship with his people, continues to care for and nurture the relationship even when the people fail to do so. This unconditional love found in the vineyard is a sign of hope. In the Parable of the Tenants, the vineyard symbolizes God's people, whom he gathers in. The tenants, those entrusted to care for the vineyard, do not permit the landowner's (God's) servants to gather what belongs to the landowner. The landowner even sends his own son (Jesus). Today's Gospel Jesus exposes the religious leaders for their failure to heed God's messengers. It is an opportunity for us to consider how we respond to those who are God's messengers today, calling us to correct our ways and return to the way of the Lord.

Living as Disciples: In the parable, God sends prophets and His Son, Jesus, to Israel, but they're repeatedly rejected, symbolizing historical dismissals of God's messengers. This story teaches us about discipleship: we must recognize our role as caretakers of God's gifts, including the Gospel and our personal talents, and understand that neglecting or betraying these divine responsibilities carries serious consequences.

The Missionary Family: In family life, this gospel teaches us to be grateful for our blessings, share with others, listen to wise advice, fulfill our roles responsibly, and understand that actions have consequences. This means appreciating each other, working together, valuing guidance from family members, and taking responsibility for our actions.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

**Question for Children:** Why is it important to follow through on your promises to others?

Question for Youth: What are some of God's rules that we must

follow? How do we respond to God's messengers today?

**Question for Adults:** When have your actions not measured up to your promises? What was the outcome?


